

In 2019, the Village of Egg Harbor expanded its yard waste compost program to include food waste. With the help of the DNR and our Compost University-trained Public Works team, a pilot program was launched in conjunction with Main Street Market and select businesses.

Then, in 2023 - the Village was awarded a Compost and Food Waste Reduction Grant with the USDA, allowing us to improve our site, and expand the program.

WHY COMPOST?

- Food scraps take decades to break down in landfill and in the process produce methane, a harmful greenhouse gas.
- Studies show that letting customers know you donate and/or compost your food scraps can boost customer loyalty.
- We are boosting the soil health and inturn, the community!

HOW IT WORKS

- Green Tier staff will meet with you to do an assessment of what your business can compost and help you to develop a program including kitchen logistics, signage and staff training.
- Once a week, starting on June 5, the Village Staff, in conjunction with volunteers will arrive at your business to pick up food waste. They will take your full bucket(s) and leave a clean one (s)!

May 16: Deadline to Sign Up

May 21: Buckets Dropped off at Business

June 5: Wednesday Pick up Begins and continues Wed afternoons.

Oct. 16: Last Pick up of the season
